UNDER 6 MONTHS
THE CHILD MUST BE SECURED IN A REARWARD FACING CHILD RESTRAINT

6 MONTHS - UNDER 4 YEARS
THE CHILD MUST BE SECURED IN A FORWARD FACING CHILD RESTRAINT

4 - 7 YEARS
THE CHILD MUST BE SECURED IN A FORWARD FACING CHILD RESTRAINT OR BOOSTER SEAT

CHILD RESTRAINT GUIDELINES USA

Please be aware that we do not allow any children under the age of 4 years old to travel in our Hitop or Kuga Campervans!
